This prestigious competition is open to any turner resident in Great Britain and is for a set exercise, namely:-

### **A Pair of Presentation Boxes**

**The competition will be in two sections, one for plain turning and a second for ornamental/rose engine turning. Prizes of £1250, £500 and £250 will be awarded for each section.**

#### **RULES AND CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO BOTH SECTIONS OF THE COMPETITION**

1. The Pair of Presentation Boxes must be turned on a lathe.
2. There are no restrictions as to size or style. They shall be a pair (but not necessarily identical)
3. Any materials may be used with the exception of ivory.
4. Applied finish is optional.
5. All work must have been executed by the competitor, except commercially made components, such as screws.
6. Winners of previous competitions may enter but the work must not have been entered for any other competition of the Company. Competitors may enter only one section of the Master's Competition and may enter only one piece.
7. The judges will consider the appeal of the design and appropriateness of the materials used, technical excellence, originality and difficulty of techniques employed and quality of finish.
8. The Judges' decision shall be final and binding on all competitors. In particular, the judges may consider that a piece has been entered into the wrong section of the competition, and order that it be judged within the other section.
9. A First Prize of £1250 and a certificate will be awarded for the winning entry in each part of the Master's Competition, a Prize of £500 and a certificate will be awarded for the second best entries and a Prize of £250 and a certificate will be awarded for the third best entries. If the quality of entries is outstanding a certificate may also be awarded for the fourth best entries.
10. No prize shall be awarded if the best entry in a particular section of the competition is considered by the judges to be of insufficiently high standard. In such circumstances a certificate of commendation may be awarded if considered appropriate.
11. The First Prize-winning entry in each section of the competition shall be retained by the Company; the other prize-winning entries will be returned to the makers.
12. Entry forms may be obtained from the Secretary of your organisation or, for independent turners, from the Clerk of the Company or from the Company website. Completed forms must be returned to the Clerk by 11th June 2010
13. Each entry, with a label stating clearly the name of the competition for which it is entered must be delivered to the Reception Steward at Apothecaries' Hall between 10.00 am and 12.00 noon on the morning of the Competition. Alternatively, entries may be mailed or otherwise delivered to one of the reception centres (addresses and details to be announced later).
14. An adhesive marker (or equivalent) unique to the competitor will be applied to the underside of each entry.
15. All entries not retained by the Company must be removed from Apothecaries' Hall by 6.00 pm on the afternoon of the Competition. Un-collected entries will be returned via one of the reception centres.

18. The work must be substantially completed by mechanical means (ornamental/rose engine). Other techniques such as carving, polychromatic assembly, marquetry, inlay and the like, may also be incorporated.

### RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. There are no restrictions as to subject, size, shape or style.
2. Any materials may be used with the exception of ivory.
3. Applied finish is optional. The work may be turned by hand (plain turning) or, by mechanical means (ornamental and/or rose turning) or, by a combination of both. Other techniques such as carving, polychromatic assembly, marquetry, inlay etc., may also be incorporated.
4. All work must have been executed by the competitor; except commercially made components, such as screws.
5. There is no restriction on the number of entries by each competitor and winners of previous competitions may enter, but the work must not have been entered for any other competition of the Company.
6. The judges will consider the appeal of the design and appropriateness of the materials used, technical excellence, novelty of concept and originality, difficulty of techniques employed and quality of finish.
7. The Judges' decision shall be final and binding on all competitors.
8. A trophy, to be retained by the winner, a prize of £1250, a certificate and a Hegner UK voucher for £50 will be awarded for the winning entry. The entry judged second will a prize of £500 and a Robert Sorby voucher for £100 while the third will receive £250 and a Craft Supplies voucher for £50.
9. No award shall be made if the best entry is considered by the judges to be of insufficiently high standard. In such circumstances a certificate of commendation may be awarded if considered appropriate.

### **A Matching Pair of Egg-Cups**

**for which Prizes of £250, £150, £100 and,  
if the standard is exceptional, a further prize of £50  
will be awarded.**

#### **RULES AND CONDITIONS**

1. The Matching Pair of Egg-cups must be turned on a lathe.
2. There are no restrictions as to size, shape or style.
3. Any species of wood may be used and any other materials, with the exception of ivory, may be incorporated.
4. Applied finish is optional.
5. The work may be turned by hand (plain turning) or, by mechanical means (ornamental and/or rose turning) or, by a combination of both. Other techniques such as carving, polychromatic assembly, marquetry, inlay etc., may also be incorporated.
6. All work must have been executed by the competitor except commercially made components, such as screws.
7. There is no restriction on the number of entries by each competitor and winners of previous competitions may enter, but the work must not have been entered for any other competition of the Company.
8. The judges will consider the appeal of the design, technical excellence, originality and quality of finish.
9. The Judges' decision shall be final and binding on all competitors.
10. A First Prize of £250, a certificate and a Hegner UK voucher for £50 will be awarded for the winning entry, a Second Prize of £150, a certificate and a Craft Supplies voucher for £50 will be awarded for the second best entry while a Prize of £100, a certificate and a Rustins voucher for £50 will be awarded for the third best entry. In the event that the quality of entries is outstanding, a Prize of £50, a certificate and a one year subscription to "Woodturning" may also be awarded for the fourth best entry.
11. The entries will all be returned to the makers.
12. No prize shall be awarded if the best entries are considered by the judges to be of insufficiently high standard.

**THE LADY GERTRUDE CRAWFORD, FRED HOWE**  
**AND H.E.TWENTYMAN COMPETITIONS FOR ORNAMENTAL TURNING**

These competitions are for ornamental and rose turning of a high standard. They are held in honour of these three great exponents and patrons of ornamental turning and are open to all members of the Society of Ornamental Turners.

**RULES AND CONDITIONS**

1. The subject for each competition is unrestricted.
2. The techniques to be used for each competition are:-
  - a. For the Lady Gertrude Crawford Competition a significant proportion of the work must be executed by conventional ornamental turning methods but all forms of rose turning are excluded.
  - b. For the Fred Howe Competition a significant proportion of the work must be executed by rose turning or by a combination of both ornamental turning and rose turning methods.
  - c. For the H.E.Twentyman Competition the work must be of predominantly plain form (but not necessarily of circular section) with the addition of a discrete element of ornamentation using either or both conventional ornamental turning and rose-turning techniques.
3. In each competition the basic form may be produced by hand (plain) turning or, by mechanical (ornamental) turning or, by a combination of both. Other techniques such as carving, polychromatic assembly, marquetry, inlay etc., may also be used as design features but these will not be considered for technical merit.
4. There are no restrictions as to style, dimensions, materials used or finish applied, if any, but all work must be executed by the competitor; except commercially made components, such as screws.
5. There is no restriction on the number of entries by each competitor but the work must not have been entered in any other competition of the Company.
6. The judges will consider the appeal of the design, technical excellence, originality and difficulty of techniques employed, quality of finish, and appropriateness of materials.
7. The Judges' decision shall be final and binding on all competitors.
8. A Cash Prize of £200, a £50 voucher from Craft Supplies and a Company Gold Medal will be awarded to the winner of the Lady Gertrude Crawford Competition; a Cash Prize of £200, a £50 voucher from Axminster Tools and a Company Gold Medal will be awarded to the winner of the Fred Howe Competition; a Cash Prize of £100, a one year subscription to "British Woodworking" and a Company Silver Medal will be awarded to the winner of the H.E.Twentyman Competition. These awards do not constitute first and second prizes as the competitions are completely separate. The Cash Prize, together with voucher and Certificate, shall be awarded for the best entry in each category. A Medal will be awarded for the best entry by a competitor who is not a previous winner of that medal.
9. Medals shall not be awarded if the best entries are considered by the judges to be of insufficiently high standard. In such circumstances certificates of commendation may be awarded if considered appropriate.
10. Previous winners must indicate the fact by affixing a 'red dot' label to the underside of their entry.
11. If the best entry in any competition is by a previous winner of that category, that competitor shall not receive another medal but shall receive a Certificate as "Master of Ornamental Turning" in that competition.
12. Entry forms are available from the Clerk by post or the Turners' Company website and must be returned to him by 11th June 2010
13. The winning entries will be returned to the makers.
14. Each entry, with a label stating clearly the name of the competition for which it is entered must be delivered to the Reception Steward at Apothecaries' Hall between 10.00 am and 12.00 noon on the morning of the Competition. Alternatively, entries may be mailed or otherwise delivered to one of the reception centres (addresses and details to be announced later).

The Apothecaries' Hall is close to Blackfriars Station but it should be noted that the underground services to this station will not be running in 2010 due to reconstruction work although the mainline services will not be affected. Alternative tube stations are Temple and St.Pauls

### RULES AND CONDITIONS

1. This competition is for plain turning of a high standard and is open to all members of the Association of Woodturners of Great Britain.
2. There shall be two main classes and one special class:
  - a. **Senior.** The prizes will be a Gold Medal, £200 and a Record Power voucher for £100; a Silver Medal, £150 and a voucher for £50 from Ashley Iles; a Bronze Medal, £100 and a voucher for £50 from Rustins. There will also be prizes of £50 and a one year subscription to "Woodturning" for the three runners up. Certificates of the Worshipful Company of Turners will be awarded to all winners. The cash prizes are donated by the A.W.G.B.
  - b. **Junior, for members of 18 years or younger.** The prizes will be a Silver Medal, £125 and a voucher for £50 from Rustins; and a Bronze Medal, £75 and a one year subscription to "Good Woodworking". In addition, there will be a prize of £50 and a one year subscription to "The Woodworker" for the runner up. Certificates of the Worshipful Company of Turners will be awarded to all winners. The cash prizes are donated by the A.W.G.B.
  - c. **The Ray Key Special Youth Competition.** This section is for those who have attended any of the Worshipful Company of Turners and AWGB sponsored Youth Training days, and are still eligible, that is 18 years old or younger. On these training days the young people have been taught safe turning practice and safe turning enhancement skills. A creative challenge has been set, with the provision of wood by Ray Key.  
A Sycamore Square 175mm x 175mm x 38mm thick and an Ash Square 62mm x 62mm x 225mm long  
How the two pieces of wood are used is only limited by the competitor's imagination.e.g. the two pieces can be combined into a single piece or two or more separate items may be made. The only restriction is that only the wood supplied may be used.  
The winner will be awarded the A.W.G.B. Geoff Cox Youth Trophy, £100 from the Worshipful Company of Turners and a one year subscription to "Woodturning". The runner up will receive £25 from the Worshipful Company of Turners and a one year subscription to "Living Wood".
3. There are no restrictions as to subject or techniques employed although those entering the Special Youth Competition must utilize the materials provided by Ray Key.
4. There are no restrictions as to style, dimensions, materials used (but see rule 3 above for the Ray Key competition) or finish applied, if any, but all work must be executed by the competitor; except commercially made components, such as screws, mechanisms.
5. There is no restriction on the number of entries by each competitor but the work must not have been entered in any other competition of the Company.
6. The Judges' decision shall be final and binding on all competitors.
7. Medals and prizes shall not be awarded if the best entries are considered by the judges to be of insufficiently high standard. In such circumstances certificates of commendation may be awarded if considered appropriate.
8. The winning entries will be returned to the makers.
